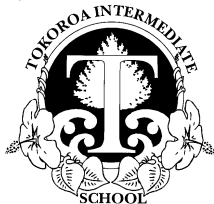

TOKOROA TENNIS CLUB

The Tokoroa Tennis Club is concerned about the survival of our club. Membership is low and we have been discussing how to increase this, especially our junior membership (8yrs-16yrs).

At present we have a junior session on Friday evenings from 5.00pm – 7.00pm. We have been questioning whether we would get more players if we moved this junior session to Saturday mornings from 8.30am – 10.00am.

Seniors play on Saturday mornings and the idea is that seniors would be able to support the younger players and help to feed them into senior play as they become strong enough. Senior play would be moved to follow the juniors. At present senior play is Saturday morning 9.00am – 11.00am.

To do this we need to survey school students and their parents to gain some idea of what the preferred day would be. There is no point in changing unless it will be supported.
